The Bay Area politician's October proposal - his third such attempt to pass federal regulation of the camps - calls for a database and full disclosure of staff credentials at residential programs. However, Miller's proposal doesn't call for oversight of day programs like the one captured in the videos.

Miller's bill does encourage states to create their own oversight and regulation of boot camps, according to a Democratic aide who worked on the Miller proposal and spoke on the condition of anonymity.

Unlike Miller's plan, Portantino suggests specific reforms designed to prevent boot camps from employing abusive tactics.

Portantino also wants to be assured that drill instructors are fingerprinted, certified and are mandated to report incidents of child abuse.

The two-term Assembly member also wants to put an end to tactics that landed McFarland in court on kidnapping charges in May.

On May 16, prosecutors say, McFarland handcuffed a truant Pasadena teen and extorted money from her family.

He was arrested May 27 on suspicion of kidnapping, extortion, child abuse, child endangerment, all felonies, as well as misdemeanor unlawful use of a badge.

McFarland is due in court Dec. 15.

At least two other teens have reported that McFarland has handcuffed them, pulled them from their beds and forced them to train all day. Parents connected to the McFarland camp have said handcuffing was a "training technique."

Helen Edwards, who financed McFarland's camp and kept his books, said he handcuffed truant teens in order to "recruit" them, targeting poor Latino students in the process.

Portantino promised that the recent clashes with Democratic leadership in Sacramento won't derail efforts to push through boot-camp reforms.

"I don't think there is a person alive who doesn't think the safety of our children is paramount," he said.
