

or control and that he will not use or attempt to use any original or copy of any Pennsylvania teaching certificate for any purpose. Respondent further agreed to make application with the Pennsylvania Standards and Practices Commission should he seek reinstatement of his Pennsylvania teaching certificate.

By letter dated February 12, 1997, the Commission notified Respondent and the Department that it would consider the Department's motion on March 4, 1997. On that date, counsel for the Department appeared before the Commission and presented the Department's motion. Neither Respondent nor a representative appeared.

Upon consideration of the Department's motion and the agreement between the parties, the Commission will grant the Department's Motion for Entry of Order and will revoke Respondent's Pennsylvania teaching certificates. Thus, the following order shall be entered:

ORDER

AND NOW, this 7th day of March, 1997, upon consideration of the Department of Education's Motion for Entry of Order and the agreement between the parties, it is hereby ORDERED that the Department's Motion for Entry of Order is GRANTED and that Respondent's teaching certificate is REVOKED.
