## Kentucky jailer jailed

PARIS, Ky. — A jailer in central Kentucky has been sentenced to 90 days in jail after a jury convicted him on criminal charges following the death of an inmate.

The Lexington Herald-Leader reported the Bourbon County Circuit Court jury convicted Tony Horn on two misdemeanor counts of criminal attempt to tamper with physical evidence.

The finding Tuesday night was to lesser charges than Horn had been indicted on — two felony counts of evidence tampering and two counts of official misconduct.

Horn was accused of ordering the destruction of e-mails concerning the death of inmate Daniel Trimble, who committed suicide in February 2008.

He will serve his sentence in the Clark County Jail.

Horn plans to run as a Republican this fall for Bourbon County judge-executive.
